

- Dress/ Casual Shirts (Half / Full sleeves).
- T shirts without any images, messages, graphics & write ups
- Dress/Casual Shoes or Joggers with Socks. (No Sandals)
- Shalwar Qameez with Shoes (only Friday)
- Suit/Combination
- Coat/ Pullovers /Sweater /Jacket in winter

For Female Students:

- Shalwar Qameez. (No Sleeveless)
- Hijab, Abaya, Chaddar etc.
- Full length trousers with long shirt / Kurta. (No tights)
- Light Jewellery & light make up
- Shoes, Sandals & Joggers
- Dupatta/Scarf compulsory with all dresses.

For non compliance following disciplinary actions will be undertaken:

- Written warning on 1 occasion.
- Fine of Rs. 5000/- on 2 occasion.
- Barring attendance of classes on 3 occasion

Smoking/Intoxication

Smoking/Intoxication is strictly prohibited in campus premises. A fine of Rs. 5000/= on first offence and / or expulsion could result on repeated offence.

Library Service

Services provided by our library, the main aim is to meet the needs of the Faculty's staff and students by providing excellent service, supporting research, learning and teaching, and ensuring that our facilities and services are accessible to everyone. Our librarians are always available to provide help, advice and training on accessing and using our library's resources.

- The library has the link with HEC Digital Library, having access to thousands of research journals, publications and books etc.
- Qurtuba library has the latest editions of books on leading subjects, voluminous references material, periodicals, magazines, journals, CDs and audio-visual cassettes on computer science and information technology, etc.
- The library subscribes to a good number of periodicals, journals and news papers in Urdu and English. Subject and author indices are being programmed in computer network, and are available to students and faculty. It will facilitate search of reading material.
- The library is regularly equipped with new books and latest editions on Computer Sciences, Information Technology, Business Administration, Political Science, International Relations, Education, Law, Mathematics, Statistics and other relevant subjects.
- Through assignments, research papers, seminars and workshops, the students are encouraged to use the library and the Internet facilities extensively.

Bachelor & Master Programs Rules and Regulations

Students convicted for moral turpitude by a court of law, and those rusticated/expelled during academic career, shall not be admitted to any programme. However, candidates having been rusticated in the past for indiscipline may be considered for admission by the President on conditions to be specified by the Admission Committee. Similarly, students involved in political activities during their academic career and having been penalized either by their educational institution, or a court of law, shall be refused admission by the University.

Admission Procedure

1. Admission shall be based on merit and merit, in turn, will be determined by the Admission Committee, as per laid down admission criteria.
2. If any candidate fails to appear before the Admission Committee for interview or for admission test on the fixed date and time, he/she may be considered for admission with late fee payment.
3. Candidates shall apply to the University within 10 (ten) days of the declaration of result of the examination of the qualifying program of study for the relevant program or by the date as announced by the University.

4. If any of the particulars given by a candidate in his/her application for admission are found incorrect or false, or if material facts are suppressed by him/her, he/she shall be refused admission. If incorrect or false statement or suppression of facts is detected after candidate has been granted admission, his/her admission shall be cancelled and his/her name removed from the University rolls. NO REFUND of dues paid, shall be admissible.

Admission to the University not being a matter of right, shall be selective and on the basis of merit.

5. Foreign students will be eligible for admission only if their applications are routed through the concerned agencies designated by the Govt. Of Pakistan and they meet the requirements for admission.

7. Under the unavoidable/extra-ordinary circumstances a student will be entitled to defer or freeze not more than two semesters according to the prescribed procedure.

8. Deferment of semester (s) shall be counted toward the maximum number of semester permissible under the regulations.

Documents Required

Photocopies of Original certificates / degree of the last qualifying examination duly verified by the concerned issuing

Board / University should be attached.

All applications shall have the following enclosures:

- 1) Photocopies of the certificates of examinations passed and detailed marks certificates, duly attested by a BPS-17 or above officer/equivalent. original documents will also be checked by the admission committee at the time of interview.
- 2) Character certificate from the institution last attended or, in the case of private candidates, a certificate of good character signed by a Magistrate first class, Nazim, MPA or MNA of the area, or Headmaster/Headmistress of the High School, or any other officer of equal or higher rank.
- 3) Three passport size photographs. In case of females, three specimen signatures attested by any officer mentioned under sub-clause "b" if they do not want to attach photographs.

4) Migration certificate (original) in the case of students who have passed the last qualifying examination from any Board/ University of Pakistan.

5) National Identity Card (Photocopies) of the candidate or father of the candidate duly attested by a BPS-17 or above officer.

6) Domicile Certificate

7) NOC from employer in case of a serving candidate.

8) NOC from the designated Government agencies in case of foreign national. ? Submitting incomplete, false or misleading information is a justifiable ground of denial for admission and removal from the University rolls, at any time.

Fee Structure

? Every student will pay admission, tuition and other fees/dues (as prescribed by the University from time to time) at the time of registration, and at the start of each semester. The University has the discretion to review and increase the University fee, charges etc at any time without the parents or students consent. Additional fee for the thesis/dissertation/internship/ project for Master Programs will be charged separately. ? Foreign/ International Students will be charged according to the fee structure suggested by the finance committee in each semester

Disciplinary & Examination Committee

There shall be Disciplinary and Examination Committee to supervise the conduct of students and examination. The committee shall be constituted by the Vice Chancellor/President.

The Committee shall deal with matters referred to it by the Students Discipline and Academic/Examination Sub-Committee relating to • eneral disci • line of students and use of unfair means in the examination, and to recommend to the Vice-Chancellor or the President, action to be taken in each case.

Entry Test:

Every student (having minimum 2nd Division) desirous to seek admission at Qurtuba University will have to qualify test and interview. (Specimen of the Entry Test is given at the end).

All dues of the current semester are to be deposited within the stipulated time period, failing which the seat may be allotted to other candidate on waiting list.

Students Conduct & Discipline

Enrolment at Qurtuba University obligates the students to behave in a responsible and disciplined manner, both inside and outside the University. Failure to do so will result in imposition of penalty, ranging from fine to rustication or expulsion from the University, in accordance with "Students Conduct & Discipline Regulations".

Attendance

A student is required to have attended at least 85% (in all subjects), lectures delivered and practical/laboratory work conducted before he/she is allowed to sit in the mid-term and final examination in a semester. A student falling short of this requirement may be debarred from sitting in an examination or his papers will be cancel.

Absence from Classes

Unauthorized absence from class for four days continuously may result in suspension from the Department/University, and unauthorized absence for two weeks, on the whole, during a semester, will result in removal from the University rolls.

Action Against Misconduct

Every member of the Faculty shall have the power to check any disorderly or improper conduct or any breach of regulations by a student in any part of the University or outside. Misconduct in a classroom, when a student is under the charge of a teacher, shall not be allowed and a punitive action such as a fine, barring from the classroom, or a punishment of greater magnitude, may be imposed as decided by the authority so empowered.

The Student Advisor

The Student Advisor or any other employee authorized by the President / Vice-Chancellor shall be responsible for the maintenance of law and order in the premises of the University.

Prohibited Acts

The following acts are prohibited for students at the premises of the University:

- a) Smoking in the University premises, classroom, laboratory, library, examination hall and auditorium, and during academic functions.
- b) Provision and consumption of alcoholic drinks or other intoxicating drugs within the University Campus or during sports, cultural tours, survey campus or entering such places or attending any such tours or campus while under the influence of intoxicants.
- c) Organizing or taking part in any function inside/ out side the campus or organization of any club or society of students, unless the competent authority may permit.
- d) Indulging in political activities.
- e) Collecting any money or receiving funds or pecuniary assistance for or on behalf of the University, except with the written permission of the person authorized in this behalf.
- f) Staging, inciting or participating in or abetting any walk-out, strike or other form of agitation against the University, or its teachers, officers or authorities; inciting any one to violence, disruption of the peaceful atmosphere in any way; making inflammatory speeches or gestures which may cause resentment; issuing of pamphlets or cartoons, casting aspersions on the teachers or staff or authorities/ bodies, or doing anything in any way likely to promote rift and hatred among the students, issuing statements in the press, making false accusations or lowering the prestige of the University.
- g) Using of mobile for listening music, watching movies/ pictures or internet surfing in classes, examination hall and university premises is prohibited.
- h) Taking photographs / making videos by mobile / camera in the class / and university premises, without prior permission of the competent authority.
- i) Breach of student code of conduct given in a regulation G (1)
- j) Harassment of female students in the University / outside the University by a student

Acts of Indiscipline

A student who;

- a) commits a breach of conduct specified in these regulations;
- b) disobeys the lawful orders of a teacher or other person in authority;
- c) habitually neglects his work or absents himself from the classroom without valid reason;
- d) damages the University, public or private property or the property of fellow-students or any teacher or employee of the University;
- e) does not pay the fees, fines, or other dues in time payable under the laid down rules and regulations
- f) uses indecent language, wears immodest dress, makes indecent remarks or gestures, or behaves in a disorderly manner; commits any criminal, immoral or dishonorable act (whether committed within the University or outside), or any act which is prejudicial to the interest of the University; shall be liable, for each such act, to the penalties specified hereunder, and from time to time, through written orders, notifications, or included in these regulations.

Rustication and Expulsion

Rustication

- i) This penalty, when imposed on a student, will normally mean the loss of one or two semesters in so far as attending classes and appearance in the university examinations is concerned.
- ii) The name of rusticated student will be struck off the rolls and no refund of fees/dues paid is permissible.
- iii) Provided that in case of gross indiscipline warranting immediate action against a student, the Vice-Chancellor shall be competent to issue orders of rustication of the student for a period to be specified.

Expulsion

- i) The Head of Department/Institution/Director Academics/Senior Coordinator, shall report the name of the student who, in his opinion, has committed the offence warranting expulsion from the University, to the Vice-Chancellor through the Disciplinary & Examination Committee stating the reasons for the proposed action. The Vice-Chancellor shall then have the authority to sanction expulsion of the student from the University.
- ii) The name of the expelled student will immediately be removed from the rolls.
- iii) A student expelled shall not be re-admitted to the University.

iv) Cases of expulsion will be registered in the University records and announced to all Departments/Institutions of the University,
AS WELL AS TO OTHER UNIVERSITIES IN THE COUNTRY.

Authority to withdraw rustication before expiry of period

The authority which has the power to rusticate shall also be competent to withdraw the said orders before its expiry.

Defence by a student intended to be expelled

A student expelled from the University will be allowed a chance of presenting his defence in writing to the accusations against him. In case the defence in writing (to be submitted within three days of issuance of expulsion orders) is considered as unsatisfactory by the Vice-Chancellor, the expulsion orders shall stand implemented

Appeals

i) An appeal against the penalty of rustication/expulsion will be filed by the student with the Registrar's office withing 7 days of announcement of the punishment. Review Committee constituted by the Vice-Chancellor. The Committee will forward its recommendations to the Vice-Chancellor, who will seek orders of the President. The President's orders in the case shall be final.

ii) No appeal shall lie against the decision of an authority imposing a penalty, other than cancellation of admission, rustication or expulsion. except on the ground that such authority has imposed a penalty which it was not competent to impose.

Compensation for Loss

The Head of the Department/Institution or any teacher or officer to whom the Vice-Chancellor may delegate the powers, may instruct a student to pay compensation for any loss or damage to property belonging to the University, public, authority, or to a fellow student or an employee of the University caused by his act or negligence. If the student does not pay such compensation within a specified period, the Head of the Department/Director Academic/Senior Coordinator will proceed against the student in the manner as prescribed in these regulations.

MS/M.Phil & Ph.D Rules and Regulations

MS/ M.Phil Programs

Scheme of Studies

- Minimum 24 Credit hours course work in two semesters.
- Research thesis/two subjects of 6 credit hours.
- Research proposal approval from the BASR.
- Public Defense on completion of Research thesis.

Eligibility Criteria:

- 1 Sixteen years of schooling or 4 year education after FA/F.Sc (132 credit hours) will be compulsory for admission in M.Phil/MS Program.

- 2 University's Local Test / GRE / HAT General Tests

Conduct of Examination

There shall be two examinations in a semester, i.e. Mid Term and Final exam, in addition to assignment, book review / presentation etc. However, evaluation of independent study (of 100 marks) will be made by the panel of experts, generally the supervisory committee in a detailed presentation made by the standard at the end of semester.

The weightage of the examinations shall be as follows:

- a. Mid-term examination 30%
- b. Final examination (comprehensive) 50%
- c. Assignments/Presentations of individual courses etc. 20%

Total 100%

Comprehensive Written Test and Oral Examination (Viva-Voce) on Courses Studied & Passed

a. On the completion of the course work, a Ph.D scholar shall have to pass a comprehensive written and oral examination in the field of his studies. Fifty percent marks shall be required in the written and the oral examination separately to pass the examination. These marks shall however, not to be counted towards CG PA of a research scholar.

b. The Comprehensive written and oral examination shall be conducted by the Graduate Studies Committee

c. If a scholar fails in the comprehensive written and oral exam, he/she will be given only one more chance to pass the written and oral examination within a period of six months.

d. The details of comprehensive written and oral examination will be worked out by the Graduate Studies Committee of the research scholar. However their will be one written paper of 300 marks, with three sections of 100 marks each, and a viva voce examination carrying 100 marks.

c . A research scholar failing in a subject will be allowed only one more chance to pass the same in the following semester along with the subsequent semester subjects. In case he/she still fails to attain the required passing marks, then he/she has to take fresh classes for that subject provided the graduate studies committee has recommended extension of course work period with the approval of Vice-Chancellor. However, this extension should not be allowed beyond two semesters.

d. Research Requirements: Thesis

1. The scholar will defend his/her research proposal by the end of 2nd semester. Scholar failing to submit research proposal within one semester of the completion of course work will be served with warning or fine or both. However, the provisional admission of the research scholar who failed in submitting his/her research Proposal within one calendar year of the completion of course work will be cancelled and he/she will be struck off from the list of Ph.D students.

2. After the successful completion of course work and upon qualifying comprehensive examination, the scholar shall pursue research work for two semester for M.Phil I/MS and two calendar years for Ph.D under the guidance of a Supervisor designated by the BOASAR. However, the duration of research work may be extended by the Vice-Chancellor, upon the recommendation of supervisory committee on the request of research scholar.

3. On completion of research, the scholar shall submit a draft of thesis for scrutiny

Moreover, Graduate Education Policy, issued by Higher Education Commission, Pakistan, is effective from Fall-2023.

Fee Charges

Tuition fee and other charges for each semester may be revised (increased or decreased) at any time by the university. Besides, the semester fee, every M.Phil/Ph.D Scholar will be required to pay the evaluation fee/mail charges incurred on foreign evaluation of the thesis and remuneration to the external examiners for attending the public defence. Foreign/ International Students will be charged according to the fee structure suggested by the finance committee in each semester.
